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Operating Notes:

- Supervision ratio is 1 instructor to 1 class plus one additional instructor nearby. There is no requirement for an additional adult.
- Instructor to be trained to in-house syllabus. Refresher training as directed by session observations.
- The instructor check booking form and ask if any pupils have a physical disability or poor balance and adjust their activities accordingly

Risk – Benefit Statement: Pupils are learning the importance of having access to treated water for health and hygiene. Carrying large bottles of water, a moderate distance reminds us how lucky we are to have clean water on tap. The thrill of balancing and tipping the water down the gulley makes a special memory and an impact on learning.

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Carrying bottles of rain water	Participants	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Pupils observing at bottom of gully to be supervised and kept together ● Pupils are expected to carry two heavy bottles of rain water. School staff please inform the instructor if any pupil has a physical disability or injury which would make this unadvisable. ● Younger pupils will be allowed to take rests on this journey ● Wash hands with soapy water after handling rain water 	low
Increased risk of slipping and falling Tipping rain water down the gully	Participants	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● School to ensure that pupils have sensible footwear on ● Instructor will choose pupils that are behaving sensibly to balance on 'island' in the middle of the gully ● School staff should advise the instructor of any pupil with poor balance ● The instructor will retrieve anything dropped into the gully 	low

Weather Conditions		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● The lead instructor will review the risk assessment in view of the weather on the day. ● The instructor will amend activity if ongoing changing weather conditions effect risks
