| Slips, trips, falls. Public & dogs Walking on the reserve | Participants | Instructor leads the way, pupils walk behind, with member of staff at end of line Pupils told not to talk to public Pupils told not to stroke dogs, we stand still & wait for owner to put dog on lead Wet, uneven ground in den building area means builds will be instructed to walk during activity | low |
| Road Accident Crossing the haul road | All | The haul road is used by sand lorries and heavy plant machinery going to the working sand quarry. Instructors will stop pupils at a safe distance before the road. Listen and look for vehicles and escort pupils across whilst standing themselves in the middle of the road. High vis tabards are available on request. | low |

| Getting lost Working in Den Building Area | Participants | Groups of pupils assigned an adult to stay in sight of at all times Boundaries set by instructor | low |
| Bump on head by log Ridge pole falling | Participants | Pupils not allow in/ under dens when they are being built or taken down Pupils told not to go inside den until adult has checked it is secure | low |
| Scratches/ eye injury from branches Over hanging branches Pupils moving branches | Participants | Instructor explains safe way to move logs and branches Pupils focus on team work and being aware of their peers Pupils who do not follow the safety instructions will be told to sit out | low |
| First Aid emergencies | | Take first aid kit & ensure it contains ice pack and sterile water Take radio | |
| Weather Conditions | | The lead instructor will review the risk assessment in view of the weather on the day. The instructor will amend activity if ongoing changing weather conditions effect risks | |
